

Monthly Case Summary

- Officers responded to Bank of The West on a report of a subject attempting to cash a counterfeit check. A 24 year old male was arrested on check fraud, drug possession and a probation violation.
- Officers responded to a report of a reckless driver. The 63 year old male driver was located and would not comply with officers orders. The suspect was charged with hit and run, evasion, resisting arrest and carrying a switchblade.
- Officers received a report of a male and female acting suspicious in the neighborhood. Upon officer arrival, both subjects ran off causing a foot pursuit. Officers detained both subjects and later released the 15 year old female to her mother on scene. The 16 year old male subject was arrested for juvenile in possession of a handgun and ammunition, carrying a loaded gun, possession of marijuana, possession of stolen property and resisting arrest. Suspect was transported to Juvenile Hall.
