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

Interim Communication and Coordination Plan (CCP)

Dear Mr. Herrmann and Mr. Ridenour:

The parties to the above-referenced order have been working on the development of a Communication and Coordination Plan. Given the short time frames set forth in the letter of extension, that work is not yet complete. Nonetheless, given that the DTSC has ordered the immediate preparation of a Vapor Intrusion Study work plan and Benicia International Associates (BIA) work to comply with this directive, Benicia International Associates sees the value in setting forth its interim plan to coordinate and communicate concerning this imminent work. To that end, please accept this letter as BIA's Interim Communication and Coordination Plan:

1. Pursuant to Section 6.1.1(a) of the above-referenced order, as amended and extended, Cecelia Fusich (BIA's designated Project Coordinator) will forward such drafts and final documents relating to the pending Vapor Intrusion Study to the individuals designated by each of the other parties. BIA will update and revise this contact information as the parties may direct in writing from time to time. BIA will notify the DTSC at such time as this contact information is changed.


2. Pursuant to Section 6.1.1(b) of the above-referenced order, as amended and extended, BIA hereby provides notice of how the technical, financial, and administrative requirements of the Order concerning the pending Vapor Intrusion Study are to be coordinated and distributed among and performed by the Respondents. Specifically, BIA will generate a Vapor Intrusion Study work plan for Buildings 90 and 165 based on the Vapor Intrusion Study previously submitted and approved for Building 156. This work will be conducted by BIA's project geologist, John Bird. This work plan will be submitted to Martin Herrmann, Project Manager for DTSC, for circulation to the appropriate personnel at DTSC for review and approval. Once approved, BIA will forward copies of the approved work plan to the primary contacts for the City of Benicia, Benicia Industries and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. Mr. Bird will perform the sampling pursuant to the approved work plan and, when the resulting data is final, Mr. Bird will generate the required report and submit it to the DTSC with copies to the primary contacts listed above.

The administrative communication required concerning the engineering work shall be conducted between Mr. Bird and Mr. Herrmann (or such other DTSC personnel as he may direct). Administrative communication concerning non-technical matters shall be handled on behalf of BIA by Cecelia Fusich (or such other individual to whom she may delegate these tasks).

Given that no financial agreement has been reached between the various parties at this time regarding allocation of costs or responsibility, BIA is advancing the funds necessary for Mr. Bird to complete the Vapor Intrusion Study work plan and related implementation of that work plan.

As provided in the order, BIA will submit all proposed changes or amendments to the DTSC for approval. In addition, BIA will continue to work diligently in an effort to develop a Supplemental Communication and Coordination Plan to address the needs of the Site after completion of the Vapor Intrusion Study.
