Councilmember Gizzi and Michael Brigandi, Executive Director, Benicia/Vallejo Humane Society, 1121 Sonoma Blvd., Vallejo, requested this item be pulled from the Consent Calendar.

Otto Giuliani, City Manager, pointed out a change made in the wording of the Ordinance; reported on complaints about dogs interacting with large crowds; violations of the Health Code if the dogs are too close to food vendors; this ordinance would be an enforcement tool for police; Chamber of Commerce and Main Street Program support this change.

Councilmember Gizzi stated that he does not agree with bringing up to average for certain cities; due to the good economy there is money in the General Fund, however \$550,000 seems very high to give in salaries when the community has needs; questioned the number of employees involved; not a reflection on the dedication or work of the employees, but rather a philosophical difference.

Mayor Messina questioned what cities were used in the salary survey; this is important for the stability of the workforce; concept of the average is a good compromise; acknowledged the needs of the City.

Otto Giuliani, City Manager, stated that this is a 5 year contract which enables the City to be able to plan the use of its future revenue.

VACATE PORTION OF EAST K STREET (EAST 3RD TO EAST 5TH ST.) AND APPROVING THE PLANS BY THE BENICIA UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT TO CONSTRUCT THE STREET CLOSURE IMPROVEMENTS

Mayor Messina proposed a three minute rule for all speakers due to the large number of citizens present that wish to speak.

On motion of Councilmember Bidou, seconded by Councilmember Corbaley, and unanimously carried, proposal of Mayor Messina was approved.

Otto Giuliani, City Manager, gave the staff report; there are two items to be considered, the Negative Declaration and the Vacation of the street; reported on the items that the Council had directed staff to look into at the last Public Hearing, the contaminated soil issue, traffic study and funding for the alleyways and waterline.

Mayor Messina opened the Public Hearing. Legal notice was given. No written protests received.

The following persons spoke:

Guy Creighton, Maintenance, Operations & Facilities Dept., Benicia Unified School District, on added cost of \$116,000; additional requirements that are not part of project.

Reg Page, School Board, Benicia Unified School District, on safety needs of citizens; traffic study; requested additional funding be deleted.

Mitch McAllister, Benicia Unified School District, design/construction, option of the overpass being impractical; fill dip in roadway rather than excavate.

Don Chew, Benicia Unified School District, design/construction time line, immediately start bids and construction will begin next spring.

Mike Noel, Toxicologist, Gallatin Consulting/Environmental Group, identified contaminants buried below a cap; no oil, grease, gas; all metals acceptable limits; reviewed Bechtel report and asphalt issue.

Jim Biega, Consultant, on traffic study; drop off and pick up area acceptable; no significant impacts.

Jamie Blomdal, 406 O'Farrell Drive, on parent concerns; larger waterlines and alleyways should not be the responsibility of School District.

Michael Lionel, 1757 Audrey Court, all of the fire concerns have been met.

Chris Barnum, 692 Abbey Court, PTA President, St. Dominic's Church, concerned about traffic congestion; supports project.

Joe Garcia, 569 East I Street, waive all fees; look at this as an investment.

Dan and Diane Smith, 365 Military East; this is something the City/School District should have done years ago; supports project.

Dan Dempsey, 598 Vecino Street, former principal of Mills Elementary School, poor visibility on street; very dangerous when congested, previous flooding of this area; supports project.

Jane West, 107 Riverview Terrace, on safety issues; parking problems at all schools during dismissals; supports project.

Howard Burkhart, 229 West G Street, added funding requests are not warranted; vote for project, but don't add cost.

John Cope, 421 Brentwood Drive; make this project a reality.

Nicole Clarke, 648 East J Street; requested approval of project.

Jessica Clarke, 648 East J Street, student at Mills; unsafe conditions when crossing K Street; supports project.

James O. Milburn, 280 East J Street; against closure.

Casey Garcia, 569 East I Street; not reasonable for this to be cost neutral, it is the City's responsibility to have the alleys paved.

Paula Tygielski, 456 East L Street; increased traffic; alleys are unsafe for children.

Miles Gress, 361 East K Street, supports closure; make alley one way, add speed bumps during grading to keep dust down.

Rob Peters, 560 Sandy Way; wording revenue neutral creates a mind set; invest in kids; supports project.

Suzanne Peters, 560 Sandy Way; extra cost will cost children.

Dick Tygielski, 456 East L Street; project is a waste of money, is against project.

Mayor Messina closed the Public Hearing.

Mayor Messina stated his support of the project; should not cost the City any hard dollars; concerned about future traffic problems, possibly use the same language previously used in the Chevron Mini Mart appeal; property revert back to City ownership if the school should close down.

Councilmember Corbaley requested a reexamination of the cost approach; should not require the School District to pay for the waterline or alley paving; supports the project.

Councilmember Whitney questioned whether it was even necessary to pave the alleyways; revisit this issue at a later time; possible need for a one-way street or do not enter signs; supports project.

Councilmember Bidou expressed concerns about the traffic problems around St. Dominic's School that might be created by this closure.

Councilmember Gizzi would like to add a restriction to the deed giving the property back to the City; monitor the alleyways.

Heather McLaughlin, City Attorney, clarified the items in the proposed motion on the street vacation and stated that a vote on the negative declaration should be taken first.

Heather McLaughlin, City Attorney, stated the second motion is adoption of a Resolution ordering the vacation of a portion of East K Street adjacent to Mills Elementary School and Liberty Field, subject to conditions of approval as modified by Council discussion, including 1) the creation of new finding of public purpose; 2) deed will contain a reverter clause in case the School District no longer uses the property so that it will come back to the City; 3) City will review and monitor the traffic issues and the School District will share the costs, this will be similar to the one used in the agreement with Chevron (West 2nd Street and Military West); 4) The alley paving or improvements to the alley will be reconsidered by staff and if they are needed, the costs will be shared 50/50 between the City and the School District. 5) Condition No. 8, which required the School District to pay for the entire waterline, will be deleted from the Resolution.
