Council Member Hughes and Staff discussed the current balance in the Intermodal Fund (\$1 million). Council Member Hughes was not concerned about

using the funds for the contract.

Council Member Campbell and Staff discussed concern regarding a 'payback loan program', and suggested just using the money, as it was simply using money from the City's reserves.

Mayor Patterson supported Staff's recommendation.

Council Member Campbell discussed concerns regarding the City loaning itself money.

Council Member loakimedes discussed concern regarding abandoning the concept of the Intermodal Train Station, as it seemed inconsistent with the City's Climate Action Plan. He agreed it was important to maintain consistency with the outside counsel representing the City with labor negotiations. He supported Staff's recommendations.

Vice Mayor Schwartzman discussed the importance of keeping the Intermodal Fund whole. He could not support this agenda item because of the proposed funding mechanism.
