***P3a. Description:**

This Victorian period house is Queen Anne in style with an L-shape plan and a raised foundation. A double front gable roof has enclosed eaves. The gables are finished with a molded fascia and plain cornice. The gable ends are clad with fish scale shingles. A projecting canted bay is found on the west side of the front elevation while a three-quarter length porch occupies the east side. The porch is covered by a shed roof which is supported on turned posts and curved brackets. The porch roof and the bay gable roof are tied together by a plain cornice with drop newels along the porch openings and over the west canted window. A long wooden stair provides access to the porch. There are turned balustrades, square newel posts and a rectangular patterned porch rail. Fenestration consists of singly arranged one-over-one double hung windows with wood casings and bracketed sills. Windows have been added to the basement story on the side elevations. The entry door is paneled with upper glazing. The house is clad with clapboard. This is one of three Queen Anne cottages sited side-by-side on G Street. The houses are almost identical in design and vary only slightly in detailing. Their similarities suggest that they were either built by the same builder, or derived from the same pattern book or stock design.

This building is an excellent example of the Queen Anne Cottage style of the late 1800s. Modest in size, this type of cottage derived its style from the use of canted bays, steeply gabled roofs with highly decorative gable ends, and the use of turned posts, curved brackets and elaborate newels. This house was recorded by the Historic American Building Survey and has been designated as a contributing building within the Downtown Historic District. It retains its integrity and continues to contribute.


