***P3a. Description**

This is a typical L-plan Queen Anne Cottage with a raised foundation. It was constructed in the late 1890s and a building of this general form and plan appears on the 1913 Sanborn Map at this location. The building has a combination hip and gable roof of moderate slope. A projecting front gable wing is located on the east side of the front elevation. It is characterized by a decorative gable end trimmed with a molded fascia and a sunburst. Closed eaves are supported on brackets. A canted bay is set under the gable with one-over-one double hung windows in wood casings. The west side of the front elevation is occupied by an elevated porch covered with a shed roof supported on turned posts. A decorative fretwork trims the eave. A replacement open rail encloses the porch. The entry is accessed via a wooden stair with turned balustrade and newel posts. Fenestration is double hung and occurs singly and in pairs. Cladding is clapboard.
