***P3a. Description**

This was originally constructed as a fourplex dwelling, probably in the late 19th century. It does not appear on the Sanborn Maps prior to 1913 because the earlier maps did not extend this far west on G Street. The building has a U-shape plan with the U oriented toward the street. A porch is inset between the projecting front gables. It has a cross gable roof with prominent dual front gables. While fenestration appears to be placed within original openings, all glazing is replacement. There are four separate entry doors on the front elevation. Doors are modern. The porch is enclosed with wrought iron open railing. Large skylights are located on the front cross gable. Cladding is clapboard.

This was originally a fourplex Queen Anne dwelling. Fenestration has been changed and new doors installed. The porch, although probably in the original location, has been modified by the use of elaborate wrought iron rails and balustrades that are inappropriate to the period and style of the house. Large openings have been cut in the cross gable to create skylights. Although it has been altered from its original historic appearance, it retains the original form and massing and still conveys its significance as a contributor to the Benicia Downtown Historic District.


