

## What is a C&D program?

C&D stands for construction and demolition. A C&D program is aimed to help contractors and home owners recycle the waste generated from construction and demolition projects. The California Green Standards Code, a new state law, is requiring the owner of the project to divert waste away from landfills. Local government will enforce this through a construction waste management plan.

### The California Green Standards Code

Any construction or demolition (C&D) project occurring within the city limits of Benicia is required to submit a waste management plan (WMP) as required by the 2010 California Green Standards Code § 5.408.1-5.408.4 to ensure owners complies with California laws and the City of Benicia meets it's mandated 50% waste diversion goal.

The code also allows a disposal reduction option that can be met when the project's disposal rate is less than 2 lbs. per square foot for non-residential and high rise residential or less than 4 lbs. per square foot for low-rise residential.

## Construction Waste Management Plan

The Construction Waste Management Plan consists of two parts. Part I requires projects to estimate the amount of tonnage to be disposed and diverted during construction. Part II requires projects to show what tonnage was actually diverted and disposed of. Disposal/diversion receipts or certifications are required as a part of that summary.

*Note: The code includes exceptions to the requirements; each of these exceptions allows a reduced or alternate compliance requirement. There is an exception for demolition waste diversion in consideration of local recycling facilities and markets for non-residential occupancies. Project applicants should consult with the City's Building Division to determine if exemptions are applicable.*

## Why now?

City of Benicia's Building Division reviews and approves all permitted projects required to submit a Construction Waste Management Plan. Effective January 1, 2011, the California Green Building Standards Code (CALGreen) requires all newly constructed buildings including low-rise residential and most non-residential commercial projects to develop a waste management plan and divert a minimum 50% of the construction waste.

### Is there is a minimum size project to which the code applies?

CALGreen applies to projects that require a permit from a local agency. Effective July 1, 2014, the waste diversion and planning requirements will apply to non-residential additions of 1000 square feet or more and to non-residential alteration with a permit valuation or estimated construction cost of \$200,000 or more.
