The first 30 at [Benicia Main Street](#) (90 First Street) at 11:00 AM get \$5 in Downtown Dollars to start you off.



**PLASTIC BAG BAN UPDATE FROM REPUBLIC SERVICES:** Plastic bags, which are made from petroleum, can take centuries to fully biodegrade, and have become a major source of plastic litter. A study published in January by the group Ocean Conservancy identified plastic bags as one of the most hazardous types of plastic litter for marine mammals, which get tangled up in the bags or mistake them for prey and eat them.



Last year, California passed a law banning stores from giving out plastic bags for free. It was the first statewide ban of its kind in the country. It was set to take effect this July, but the plastic bag industry stopped that from happening by financing a ballot measure to repeal the ban.

On the November ballot, Proposition 65 redirected money collected by grocery and other retail stores through the mandated sale of carryout bags into a special fund for environmental projects. This did not pass. The opposition to 65 said most retailers where the ban was in effect were not earning money from the ten cents per bag, but were still losing money or breaking even with the purchase of reusable bags.

Proposition 67 passed and upheld the statute that prohibits grocery and other stores from providing customers with single-use plastic bags or paper carryout bags, but permits the sale of recycled paper or reusable bags.

The ban takes effect when the California Secretary of State certifies the election on December 16. We will look to the State for how this will be implemented in Benicia. Until then, bringing your own reusable bags is the best solution. – *Public Works*





**ALARM RECALL:** Benicia Fire Department wants you to know about an important product recall. Kidde NightHawk combination smoke/carbon monoxide (CO) alarms (shown) have been recalled.



The alarm can fail to continue to chirp when it reaches its seven year end of life if the batteries are replaced, leading consumers to believe it is still working. This poses a risk of consumers not being alerted to a fire or CO incident in their home.

This recall involves Kidde NightHawk talking combo smoke/CO alarm with model number KN-COSM-IB and manufacture dates between June 1, 2004 and December 31, 2010. The alarms are hard-

wired into a home's electric power. The unit has a compartment on the back for the installation of a replaceable 9V backup battery. The alarm is white, round and measures about 5 to 6 inches in diameter. "Kidde" is engraved on the front of the alarm. "Kidde," the model number and manufacture dates are printed on a label on the back on the alarm.

It is recommended that consumers immediately stop using the recalled alarms and contact Kidde directly for a free replacement alarm based on date of manufacture or a discount on a new alarm. **POLICE RESERVE OFFICER SWORN IN:** On Tuesday November 8, Benicia Police Department marked a milestone with the swearing-in of Reserve Police Officer Keith Kops.

Benicia Police Department is reinstating their Reserve Police Officer Program and Officer Kops is their first reserve since the program was put on pause approximately two decades ago. Officer Kops will also be the program coordinator. He has been a reserve in a few other agencies in the past and brings a wealth of knowledge and experience with him.



Volunteer Reserve Officers have peace officer authority and supplement the department's patrol staff in patrolling the city, as well as helping with special events, responding to disaster situations, and critical incidents.

## MYRIDE COMBINES HIGH TECH WITH LOW FARES:

Thanks to a new app that launched in June, SolTrans commuters in Solano County now have all the smartphone convenience of an Uber or Lyft—yet still only pay a fraction of the fare. Now, public transit riders in Vallejo, Benicia and beyond can get real-time locations and arrival times of every SolTrans bus in operation thanks to the [MyRide app for iOS and Android](#). Just like the other rideshare apps, MyRide tells you exactly where and when your bus will arrive, so you know how long your wait time will be at any particular stop.



But the powerful MyRide app does more than just provide real-time bus locations and arrival/departure times. MyRide can also help you plan the route for your trip with SolTrans route maps right on your phone. It can also send you text alerts when your bus is close to arriving, and lists the closest bus stops complete with walking directions from wherever you are.

# SOLTRANS FINALIZES ROUTE 20 SCHEDULE ADJUSTMENTS: New schedules for SolTrans

local Route 20 went into effect on Monday, November 14. SolTrans is implementing these changes in order to improve reliability on the recently extended Route 20 to provide a better customer experience. New maps and schedules can be found online at [www.soltransride.com](http://www.soltransride.com) and are being posted at key stops along the route. The stop changes will maintain new service to Sutter Solano Medical Center, Kaiser Permanente Medical Center, and Sereno Transit Center, while eliminating lightly used stops on Fairgrounds Drive, and on Sereno Drive east of Tuolumne Street. The route will now connect Vallejo Corners (Target Shopping Center) to the hospitals by using Redwood Parkway and Tuolumne Street.

In Benicia, the route will continue to serve stops at both Casa de Vilarrasa and Rancho Benicia while adding a stop on Military East at East Fifth Street, reducing delays encountered along First Street. It will operate as a loop starting from City Park, then serving East H Street, East I Street, East Fifth Street, and Military East before passing City Park on the way to Vallejo.

The route will now operate every 120 minutes. In conjunction with the routing changes, this will allow for a reliable service. “When we instituted changes in August, we were very excited to serve new locations and better connect our two cities of Benicia and Vallejo,” said Michael Abegg, Planning & Operations Manager. “Unfortunately, in our excitement, we didn’t accurately calculate the time required to operate the new route. As a result, we ended up with an unreliable service.” He added that the staff will continue to review the route, especially to determine how to serve Six Flags Discovery Kingdom directly during the Spring and Summer, while noting that customers can still connect to Routes 5 and 85 for access to Six Flags.

Solano County Transit (SolTrans) has been the public transportation provider for south Solano County since July 2011. SolTrans provides local and regional fixed routes, complementary paratransit, dial-a-ride service, and subsidized taxi programs. The agency is a Joint Powers Authority (JPA) that is governed by a six-member Board of Directors, composed of two representatives from the cities of Benicia and Vallejo, Solano County’s representative on the Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC), and a representative from the Solano Transportation Authority. – *City Manager’s Office*

**EMERGENCY EXERCISE:** On November 10, City of Benicia personnel participated in a Solano County Emergency Exercise simulating a major earthquake. The Emergency Operations Center (EOC) was activated and staff were given a scenario that continuously changed or escalated throughout the exercise, allowing them to work out critical problems. You'll see in the photos that staff are wearing vests identifying the section they are working in, e.g.; Command, Operations, Planning, Logistics or Finance/Administration. They have specific functions laid out in our [Emergency Operations Plan](#). Staff met for a debriefing this week, discussing successes and difficulties. Training



like this helps staff be more ready to handle a major incident in our city.

In a disaster, volunteer participants come in many forms. Participating in this exercise were members of Benicia Amateur Radio Club ([BARC](#)) who helped relay information to and from the field, the Emergency Operation Center, and the County. In real world events, through the Benicia Emergency Response Team ([BERT](#)) program, trained community volunteers are divided into geographic zones and have guidance as to how to coordinate




with other members in their zone to assist during a disaster. Should additional volunteers come forward during a disaster (emergency medical personnel, etc.), they would be registered as spontaneous volunteers through the process established by the EOC.



The City of Benicia operates in accordance with the National (NIMS) and State (SEMS) incident management systems. These systems allow us to coordinate efforts during a disaster event, including the tracking of our personnel. Tracking civilian victims would be done in accordance with the

County and State plans for Mass Casualty Incidents. Each of these programs is consistent with guidelines from the State and FEMA, as well.
