
- The PD reached 5,000 Facebook followers. We would like to thank our community and followers for making this possible. We value this partnership and together we are creating a safer and more informed community.

Monthly Case Summary

- Officers responded to a call of 2 subjects trying car door handles in the parking lot of the apartment complex. When officers arrived on scene, they located a 34 year old male and a 30 year old female near the entrance. Subjects were found to have several items in their possession that did not belong to them. Officers also found property belonging to burglary victims out of Lake County. Both suspects were taken into custody and charged with prowling, possession of burglary tools, possession of stolen property, and probation violation.
- Dispatch received a report of a traffic accident involving a possible impaired driver. Officers arrived on scene and after administering field sobriety tests, they arrested a 58 year old male for driving under the influence of alcohol and driving on a suspended license.
