Benicia Run For Education



Monthly Case Summary

- Officers responded to a report of a verbal altercation between a male and female. Male has been known to have weapons on him and possibly under the influence. Officers arrested a 34 year old male for criminal threats, possession of a pipe and methamphetamine.
- While an officer was responding to a suspicious activity call, he initiated a traffic stop on a vehicle possibly involved. While attempting to identify the occupants, the driver sped off, collided into a house and 2 occupants ran off. Officers pursued the occupants and all three were eventually taken into custody. The male suspects ages 15, 18 and 19 years old were charged with evading, resisting arrest, unlicensed driver, and probation violation.
- A 911 caller reported hearing a loud crash and then observing two males running from the area. Officers arrived to find a vehicle abandoned into trees and located a 35 year old male who was charged with hit and run and driving under the influence.
