

Monthly Case Summary

- Officers responded to a report of shots fired on London Drive. As they arrived on scene, they located several shell casing in the street. Within 7 minutes of the initial call, Dispatch received a call of a vehicle accident on I780 Westbound near Military West. A Cal-Trans worker arrived at the accident to find a gunshot victim inside the vehicle. Victim was transported and Detectives are still vigorously investigating the incident.
- A local hotel called Dispatch to report a guest used a stolen credit card to check into a room and was still on scene. Dispatch mad contact with credit card owner who stated he never received the card in the mail and he did not know the subject who was in possession of his card. Officers arrested a 29 year old male from Pennsylvania for defrauding an innkeeper, possession of stolen property, credit card fraud, and possession of drug paraphernalia.
