## Monthly Case Summary

- 911 Dispatchers received a call from a female adult stating her 49 year old husband was attempting to take his life. Officers, along with fire personnel quickly responded to the scene. After carefully making entry, they located the victim in the kitchen who was pronounced deceased by the paramedics on scene.
- Dispatch received a report of an accident in a parking lot on Columbus Parkway. The caller believed that the driver may be intoxicated. Officers arrived on scene and assessed the situation. After speaking with the 62 year old female driver, she was arrested for driving under the influence of alcohol.


