## Monthly Case Summary

- Officer responded to a report of a vehicle burglary that occurred outside a convenience store. The store was able to capture a picture of an adult female accomplice who diverted attention while an adult male broke the vehicle window, removed the item and fled the scene.
- While driving through Solano Square, one of our officers observed a 40 year old male walking out of the store with a small hand basket full of alcohol. Knowing there have been many thefts of this kind recently, officers stopped the subject after seeing him place the basket on the ground and try to walk away. Subject was arrested for petty theft.


