## Monthly Case Summary

- Officer received a call from an alert citizen who heard someone behind the church near the storage containers. A subject was seen running from the scene, where he left his vehicle and identification behind. Later that morning, Detectives conducted a probation search of the suspects residence in Vallejo and arrested a 30 year old male for burglary, probation violation, and possession of narcotics.
- Officers observed a vehicle smoking badly and attempted to catch up to it. The driver stopped at a convenience store and quickly exited the vehicle. The 45 year old male was arrested on possession of a stolen vehicle, possession of stolen property, a parole hold and two warrants for suspended drivers license.


