## Monthly Case Summary

- On 9/20/16 at approximately 8:00 pm, numerous calls were placed to Benicia PD 911 and the non-emergency lines in regards to a very foul odor in the southwest part of town. Several hours later it was determined to be a fuel spill in the water between Rodeo and Vallejo.
- Officers received information on a potential threat made at Benicia High School. Numerous officers and other Police personnel responded and secured the school while they searched the campus and interviewed potential involved parties. Officers located a 15 year old male student who was arrested for criminal threats and transported to Solano County Juvenile Hall.


