

Located off Military East Street and just a few minutes from downtown Benicia, you'll find the Historic Arsenal district. The Benicia Arsenal was first built prior to the Civil War and has a long record of military excellence until it was closed in the 1960s. The Arsenal today is home to some of the best, most creatively diverse artists—many are in-residence and they are recognized both locally as well as internationally. Twice a year, in the Spring and Fall, these artists and craftsmen conduct an Open Studios event where many artists open their studios for demonstrations and sales.
