

PROCLAMATION OF A LOCAL EMERGENCY
FOR THE COUNTY OF SOLANO, STATE OF CALIFORNIA

WHEREAS, Solano County Code sections 7-12 (a) and (b) and 7-13 (a)(1) empowers the Director of Emergency Services to proclaim the existence of a Local Emergency when the County Board of Supervisors is not in session, and

WHEREAS, the Director of Emergency Services, acting through the Assistant Director of Emergency Services, finds:

(1) That at the time of this proclamation the County Board of Supervisors is not in session;

(2) That over recent days conditions of disaster or extreme peril to the safety of persons and property have occurred throughout the State of California, including within the cities of Vallejo and Fairfield, as a result of civil unrest, violence, looting, arson, and the destruction of personal and real property;

(3) That such conditions of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property may arise within the County of Solano; and


(4) That the aforesaid conditions of extreme peril may arise warrant and necessitate the proclamation of a Local Emergency; now, therefore,

IT IS HEREBY PROCLAIMED that a Local Emergency exists throughout the County of Solano, commencing on or about June 2, 2020, and

IT IS FURTHER PROCLAIMED AND ORDERED that during the existence of said Local Emergency, the powers, functions and duties of the Director of Emergency Services shall be those prescribed by state law and the ordinances, resolutions, and approved plan of the County of Solano in order to mitigate the effects of said Local Emergency, and

IT IS FURTHER PROCLAIMED AND ORDERED that said Local Emergency shall be deemed to continue to exist for the next seven (7) days, and hereafter by ratification of the County Board of Supervisors, until its termination is proclaimed by the County Board of Supervisors of the County of Solano.

PROCLAMATION OF THE DIRECTOR OF EMERGENCY SERVICES
FOR THE COUNTY OF SOLANO, STATE OF CALIFORNIA
IMPOSING A CURFEW

WHEREAS, Solano County Code sections 7-12 (a) and (b) and 7-13 (a)(1) authorizes the Director of Emergency Services, or her Assistant, to make and issue rules and regulations on matters reasonably related to the protection of life and property as affected by any conditions proclaimed; and

WHEREAS, California Government Code Section 8634 authorizes the governing body of a political subdivision, or officials designated thereby, to promulgate orders and regulations necessary to provide for the protection of life and property, including orders or regulations imposing a curfew within designated boundaries where necessary to preserve public order and safety during a Local Emergency; and

WHEREAS over recent days conditions of disaster or extreme peril to the safety of persons and property have occurred throughout the State of California, including within all of the cities of Solano County, as a result of civil unrest, violence, looting, arson, and the destruction of personal and real property;

WHEREAS, on June 2, 2020, the Assistant Director of Emergency Services, pursuant to the authority granted to him under Solano County Code sections 7-12 (a) and (b) and 7-13 (a)(1), proclaimed the existence of a Local Emergency in the County of Solano (“County”) in anticipation that such conditions of extreme peril may arise within the County; therefore,

IT IS HEREBY PROCLAIMED AND ORDERED THAT:

1. A curfew is hereby imposed Countywide, within both the incorporated and unincorporated areas of the County, in order to preserve the public order and safety.
2. It shall be unlawful for any person, other than those set forth in Paragraph 3 below, to be upon any public street, avenue, boulevard, place, walkway, alley, or park, or to otherwise be in any public area or unimproved private realty within the County between the hours of **8:00 p.m. through 5:00 a.m. only**. This curfew will expire at 5:00 a.m. on June 4, 2020.


3. This Order shall not apply to: peace officers; fire fighters; emergency operations personnel; the National Guard or other military personnel deployed to the area; individuals traveling to and from work; authorized members of the media; “Essential Critical Infrastructure Workers” as designated by the State Public Health Officer; people experiencing homelessness and without access to a viable shelter; and individuals seeking medical attention.

Any violation of this curfew Order is a misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment of up to six (6) months in jail, a fine of up to one thousand (\$1,000) dollars, or both, as provided by any applicable state or municipal law.

In the event that the terms of the County’s curfew Order are more stringent (e.g. that the start time is earlier or the end time is later) than any city’s local curfew order, the County’s curfew Order would apply within and supersede the city’s local order to that extent.

IT IS FURTHER PROCLAIMED AND ORDERED that this curfew Order shall be effective immediately as of June 2, 2020, commencing at 8:00 p.m., and extending from the hours of 8:00 p.m. until 5:00 a.m. only. This Curfew will expire at 5:00 a.m. on June 4, 2020. The County may renew, amend, or extend this Order in accordance with California Government Code section 8634 and Solano County Code Chapter 7.
